off the drugs over the course of two weeks. At five weeks old, it was finally time for Gabby to join her mom and siblings at home.

Those five weeks of hospitalization were incredibly difficult for Catherine. She was

away from home in an unfamiliar ONALD MCDONALD city, with two toddlers and a critically ill, hospitalized child. She found respite and comfort at the Ronald McDonald

House and calls the House a "real lifesaver". Here at the house, she found a place for her and her twins to eat, sleep, and play. Most importantly, it allowed her to be at Gabby's bedside at all times, or at a moment's notice in the middle of the night.

Gabby is now a four year old, happy-golucky girl, but she still has some health issues that make some days harder than others. She's on the autism spectrum, has a sensory processing disorder, central sleep apnea, and receives physical and

occupational therapy for fine motor delay and low muscle tone in her legs But Gabby is strong, and she's fought her way to being a healthy little

Gabby, according to

her mom, is "a ball of sunshine and has been such a blessing in our lives". She's enrolled to go to preschool in the fall and Catherine says she's so thankful for everything that Ronald McDonald House Charities Detroit provided her to make their stay feel like home.


